The names are spelled in various ways, such as ORSBURN, ORSBORN and ORSBORNE; WALLIS and WALLACE; CARGIL and CARGILE, and others. Most of these spelling have been retained in this book.

The service men's pictures are taken from the 1940's book "THE MEN AND WOMEN IN THE ARMED FORCES FROM CLARK COUNTY, ARKADELPHIA, ARKANSAS", and published by Southern Publishing Co., Camden Ark.

OKOLONA MAN SERVED IN THREE WARS



NEWS FROM OKOLONA

KEN PHELPS was ready to join up to fight in World War II, but he was only 16 and his father wouldn't let him.

Two years later, in 1945, Phelps was drafted. "I was drafted in February, and the war was over in August. I went to Camp Maxey near Paris, Texas, for advanced infantry training.

"Then I went to the Philippines. I shipped out Sept. 1." He was just a few months too young to be sent into combat, he said.

From the Philippines, Phelps went to Japan where he was assigned to the section that was deactivating units.

"I tell people that I worked directly under Gen. MacArthur because he was on the sixth floor and I was on the fourth floor at general headquarters in Tokyo." Phelps said. After his two years were up, "I got out and came back to Henderson State University and got a commission.

"I volunteered to go back into the Army in 1951--after the war started." He went to Fort Jackson, S.C., for training. "I came back home, and got married. I got orders for Korea six weeks after we got married.

"I got to Korea in the fall of 1961. I was assigned to the 5th Regimental Combat Team as an infantry rifle platoon leader." Phelps said the regiment was not assigned permanently to any unit--it was attached, as needed, to other units.

"I was in the operations tent getting briefed, and I backed up into TOM WEBB from Arkadelphia." Phelps and Webb had served in the National Guard together.

Phelps' team soon had its first assignment. "They sent us up a mountain that was 1,053 meters. We stayed in that position for 10 days at a time then we'd get about a five-day break. We ran patrols out in front of our position. It was winter. It started snowing in November and didn't melt until April.

"We were the main line of resistance. The outfit I was in had been at the Yalu River when the Chinese broke through (at the beginning of the war). They lost a whole lot of men.

"There was a bunker on the mountain that had about 35 dead Chinese soldiers in it." Because of the cold weather, "It didn't smell while we were there."

On one occasion, Phelps led his platoon to attack a knoll that was occupied by Chinese. "We had two Korean soldiers assigned to the platoon. They volunteered to go throw some grenades into the enemy position. That's what started the fire fight that pinned us down.

"During this, a mortar shell went off a piece behind us, and hit one of my

people at the base of his skull." The Chinese were in a bunker; the American platoon was in the open.

The radioman called for artillery fire. "He called for the 8-inch artillery. He repeated the range nine times." After the nine barrages, the platoon was able to withdraw and call for a helicopter to pick up the wounded man.


"It was too dangerous for the pilot, so they took him on a stretcher to the forward aid station." Phelps said that trip took six hours. "I never knew what happened to him."

Phelps served 13 months in Korea. "I consider myself one of the lucky ones. I never got a scratch in all that. President Truman called that a 'police action'. I said if that was a police action, it was a pretty rough beat as far as I was concerned."

After Korea, Phelps left the Army again, but he returned to the service and completed two tours of duty in Vietnam. He retired as a major in 1972.

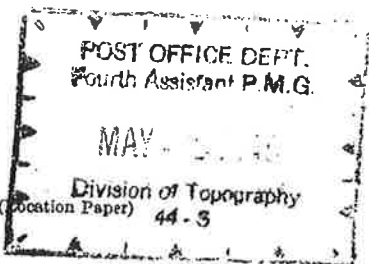

Sir: Before the Postmaster General decides upon the application for the establishment of a post office at Rome, County of Clark, State of Arkansas, it will be necessary for you to carefully answer the subjoined questions, get a neighboring postmaster to certify to the correctness of the answers, and return the location paper to the Department, addressed to me. If the site selected for the proposed office should not be on any mail route now under contract, only a "Special Office" can be established there, to be supplied with mail from some convenient point on the nearest mail route by a special carrier, for which service a sum equal to two-thirds of the amount of the salary of the postmaster at such office will be paid.

You should inform the contractor, or person performing service for him, of this application, and require him to execute the inclosed certificate as to the practicability of supplying the proposed office with mail, and return the same to the Department.

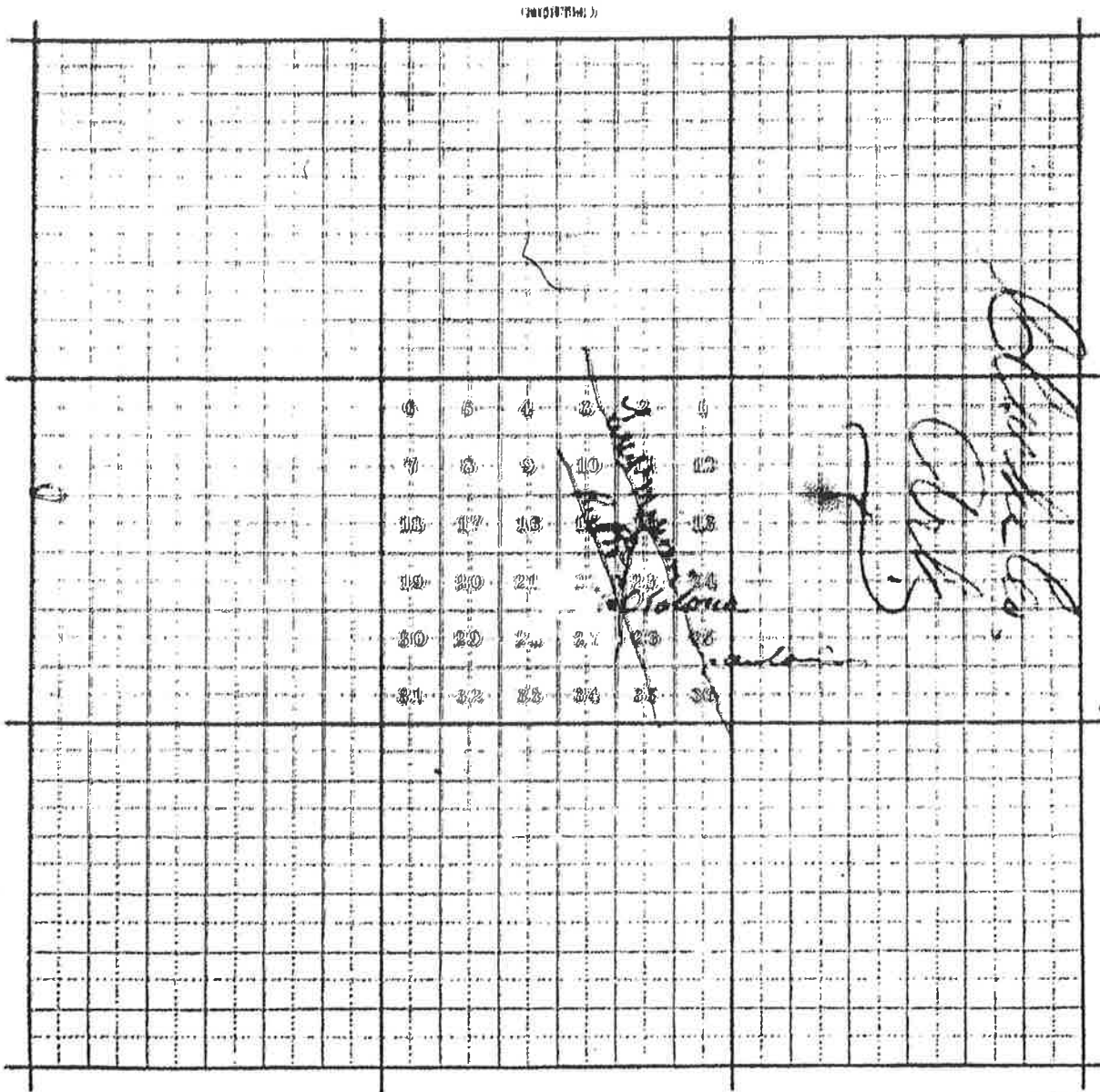

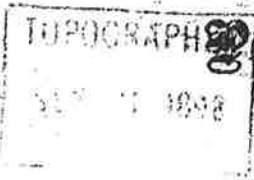

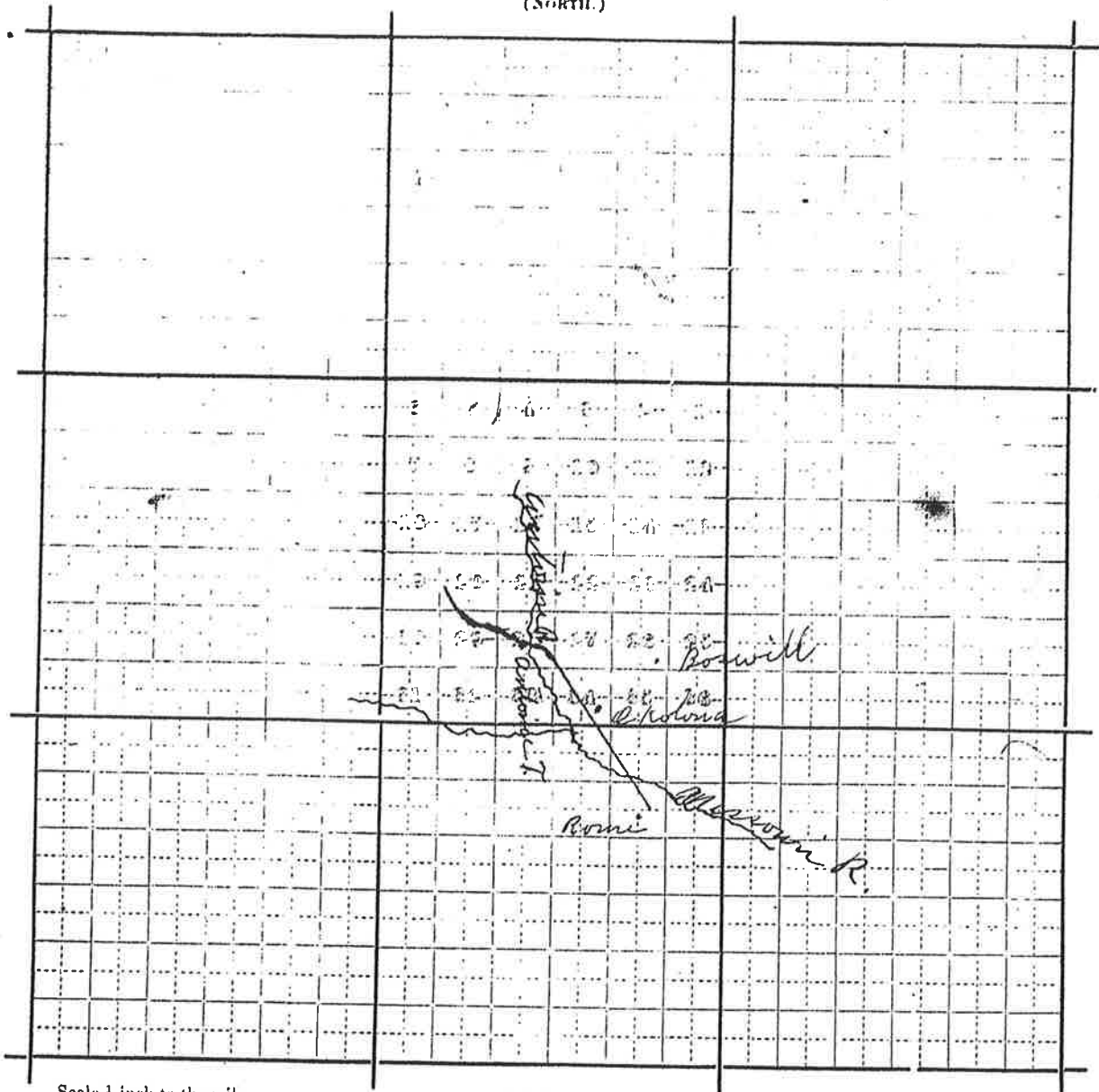

ANNOUNCES FOR COUNTY JUDGE

JASON SHACKELFORD authorizes The Gurdon Times to make official announcement of his candidacy for County Judge.

Mr. SHACKELFORD makes the following statement to the voters:

"I was born near Okolona, Ark., I lived on a farm until I was appointed rural mail carrier, on April 1, 1909, and served on route 1 and route 3 until I was transferred to route 2 at Gurdon, August 1, 1924, and served as carrier until August 19, 1934. "Our school busses must run every day. They must get our children to school in order that they may prepare themselves for the difficult years ahead.

"Our roads must be kept passable every day in the year, so that the doctors and nurses may visit and minister unto our rural people who become ill.
